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Summary of Actions

A regular meeting of the Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners (TBCE) was held May 17, 2016, in Austin. The following is a summary of Board actions taken during this meeting.

The Board voted to adopt amendments to the following rules - effective September 1, 2016:

- **Rule 78.6** - The amendment deletes an obsolete reference to a professional fee which is no longer imposed as a result of HB 7 passed under the 34th Legislature and to require application of any monetary funds received by the Board to outstanding balances.
- **Rule 78.8** - The amendment removes the requirement for a 120 day hearing that is not necessary for compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) and to permit notifications of decisions and orders by electronic means sent to the current e-mail address or tele-copier, upon agreement of the respondent's representative or the respondent, if not represented by counsel.

The Board voted to propose (for comment) the following amendments to the rules:

- **Rule 72.6** - The proposed amendment reflects the Board's most current practices in giving examinations.
- **Rule 78.6(a)** - The proposed amendment updates the rule to reflect and ratify the present fee for the TBCE's jurisprudence examination.
- **Chapter 74** - Board Staff has published notice of rule review for Chapter 74 pursuant to the Government Code §2001.039 in order to ensure consistency with the law and reach a determination of present need for the rule.
- **Rule 74.1** - The proposed amendment is part of the Board's review of Chapter 74 to fulfill its ongoing duty to conduct agency rule review.
- **Rule 74.2** - The proposed amendment is part of the Board's review of Chapter 74 to fulfill its ongoing duty to conduct agency rule review and also reflects the transfer of administration duties from the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to the Texas Medical Board (TMB) as required by Senate Bill 202.

Attention New Licensees

Your first renewal cycle is pro-rated and is usually not a full twelve months long, so completion of your Continuing Education (CE) requirements is not required until after your first license renewal.

When you renew your license for the second time, you should have completed sixteen (16) hours of approved CE, including the four (4) hours in Board-required topics and the one-time, eight (8) required hours for Medicare.

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Places of Public Accommodation – ADA Changes

Chapter 42 U.S. Code § 12182

prohibits discrimination of individuals by places of public accommodation. The rule specifically states:

(a) No individual shall be discriminated against on the basis of disability in the full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages, or accommodations of any place of public accommodation by any person who owns, leases (or leases to), or operates a place of public accommodation. 42 USCS § 12182.

A place of public accommodation is defined as:

(7) Public accommodation. The following private entities are considered public accommodations for purposes of this title [42 USCS §§ 12181 et seq.], if the operations of such entities affect commerce—

(F) a laundromat, dry-cleaner, bank, barber shop, beauty shop, travel service, shoe repair service, funeral parlor, gas station, office of an accountant or lawyer, pharmacy, insurance office, **professional office of a health care provider**, hospital, or other service establishment....42 USCS § 12181.

This is only one of the 12 categories of private entities considered places of public accommodation under Title III of the American with Disabilities Act [Codified in Chapter 42 of USCS].

Meaning that in your everyday practice as a licensed chiropractor you are financially and legally responsible for providing qualified auxiliary services to patients seeking your skill

set 28 CFR 36.303(c). If you do not comply with this you can be, as other providers have been, sued for providing inadequate communication due to patient's disability and the providers refusal to secure an interpreter or other adequate auxiliary services.

Examples of auxiliary aids include: qualified interpreters [on-site or through video-remote interpreting], qualified readers, acquisition or modification of equipment or devices, or other similar services. 28 CFR 36.303(b) (1-4). The policy reason behind this regulation is to "...ensure that no individual with a disability is excluded, denied services, segregated or otherwise treated differently than other individuals because of the absence of auxiliary aids," 28 CFR 36.303(a).

These changes to the ADA strive to improve the quality of care and services which patients with disabilities receive, especially in the health care and legal fields. Passing notes, semi-fluent translators, assumption of lip reading, and requiring an individual with disabilities to provide their own medium for communication will not suffice.

Imagine yourself in a situation where you can't understand your doctor and you know you don't have all the facts concerning your medical condition and alternatives because they can't communicate with you?

Would you still confidently take their advice? Might something potentially dangerous to the patient occur? Current case law is mainly focused on effective communication in healthcare, but the law demands this in more areas than healthcare. These services are crucial to individuals with disabilities; turning them away to "someone with more resources" is no longer an adequate solution. The cost for obtaining these services must be absorbed by the doctor and cannot be passed along to the patient. ♦

Proper Care of Your Hydrocollator

How to Avoid Unsanitary Conditions/Complaints



The Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners (TBCE) receives numerous complaints about dirty or unsanitary hydrocollators resulting in the violation of Grossly Unprofessional Conduct (Board Rule 78.1(a)(1)) for maintaining unsanitary or unsafe equipment.

A violation can lead to fines of up to \$1,000 per day and even revocation (3rd offense). Frequently, the complaints detail rust on the packs, dirty water containers, and calcium buildup have been noted.

The manufacturers provide cleaning and care instructions in the owner's manuals. Failing to maintain your equipment can not only result in voiding the warranty, it can also lead to Board sanctions.

Proper care and cleaning of your hydrocollator packs and unit will help avoid Board complaints and costly sanctions. It is difficult to keep these units clean and it is recommended that a cleaning schedule be created that requires signed acknowledgment of completion. Alternatives include electrical hot packs to avoid the mess.

The following steps, while not all exhaustive, will help avoid these issues.


CARING FOR YOUR HYDROCOLLATOR & PACKS

Weekly cleaning of your unit and hot packs is advised.

- ▶ **Watch for oozing of the clay in the packs.** If the water is turning murky or you see clay, your packs are wearing out and need to be replaced. Inspect for cuts or tears. Clean the packs with soap and water to keep them from developing a musty smell. Boiling will make packs break down faster. Do not use chlorine on the packs or in the unit. With proper care, packs will normally last approximately one year.
- ▶ **Clean your unit regularly.** It is recommended to change the water weekly. Tap water has chlorine and chlorine damages the stainless steel. It is recommended to use bottled water or purified water which does not contain chlorine to prolong the life of your unit. If you use tap water, you need to inspect your unit and racks regularly for rust. The rust will stain the hot packs and give the appearance of an unsanitary condition. Even though the packs are in towels or pack covers, the rust may bleed into the towel or pack cover and give the appearance of an unsanitary condition, or cause damage to patient clothing.
- ▶ **Do not allow your hot packs to dry out** (low water levels). Maintain proper temperature and water levels. Packs should be covered by water at all times and not exposed.
- ▶ **Unit cleaning** can best be accomplished using disinfectant, vinegar and non-abrasive scouring pads.
 - Unplug and drain your unit. Remove the racks.
 - Prepare a mixture of 2 cups vinegar to 1 cup water.
 - Using non-abrasive scouring pads and a towel, scour the inside of the hydrocollator and the racks.
 - Use the vinegar mixture to clean off any deposits and build up. Replace or repair rusty areas/parts.
 - Vinegar has antibacterial, anti-viral and anti-fungal properties and is a good non-toxic cleaner. It is often used as a more natural, less toxic cleaner by conservationists. It is also a mild acid (glacial acetic acid) which helps break down deposits. It also helps to neutralize the smell.

- Rinse with hot water and refill your unit with non-chlorinated water to cover the packs. It is a good idea to leave the heat on over the weekend to avoid stagnant water creating bacteria.
- Clean the outside of your unit with stainless steel cleaner and polish it with a polish and a towel.
- On a daily basis, it is a good idea to look for calcium stains and dried water on the outside of the unit to avoid the appearance of unsanitary conditions. Keeping a vinegar spray mixture close by can help clean up any random deposits and streaks.

Set up a schedule to regularly inspect your unit and clean it. It is a good idea that all assistants be trained in proper care and maintenance of the packs and the hydrocollator. Another alternative is to change over to using electrical hot packs that draw moisture from the air. ♦

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Sunset Review of the Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners

The mission and performance of the Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners are under review by the Legislature as required under the Texas Sunset Act. The Act provides that the Sunset Commission, composed of legislators and public members, periodically evaluate a state agency to determine if the agency is still needed and to explore ways to ensure that the agency's funds are well spent. Based on the recommendations of the Sunset Commission, the Texas Legislature ultimately decides whether an agency continues to operate into the future.

The Sunset review involves three steps. First, Sunset Commission staff will evaluate the Board of Chiropractic Examiners and issue a report in October 2016 recommending solutions to problems found. A month or so later, the Sunset Commission will meet to hear public testimony on the agency and the recommendations of the Sunset staff. Based on public input and the Sunset staff report, the Sunset Commission will adopt recommendations for the full Legislature to consider when it convenes in January 2017. Please refer to the Sunset Commission website or call the office for updated information on specific dates for these meetings.

Through the Sunset review, every Texan has the opportunity to suggest ways in which the mission and operations of the Board of Chiropractic Examiners can be strengthened.
